Organization and Mission

ORGANIZATION OF CIVIL AIR PATROL

CAPR 20-1 dated 2 January 2013 is supplemented as follows:

SUMMARY OF CHANGES: This revision updates unit commander candidate selection criteria. **Note: Shaded areas identify new or revised material.**

PART I, section D, Paragraph 14.c. (1) Added: The authority to appoint or remove Squadron and Flight Commanders is NOT delegated to Group Commanders.

PART I, section D, paragraph 14.c. (2) Added: Squadron and flight commanders will ensure that appointed Deputy Commanders for Cadets are at least 21 years of age.

PART I, section D, paragraph 14.e. Added: Group commanders will:

(a) Added: Identify high caliber candidates who are at least 21 years of age for the wing commander's consideration when squadron and flight commander replacements are needed.

(b) Added: Ensure that prior to or concurrent with appointment, the candidate will have completed the minimum required topics of the CAP Unit Commanders Course (UCC). **NOTE:** The UCC can be given in a one-on-one format, if the course is not available prior to the candidate's appointment. However, the candidate will successfully accomplish the UCC course, in a classroom setting, not more than 6 months from assuming command.

PART III—SENIOR MEMBER POSITION DESCRIPTIONS, Wing Commander, page 26, NOTE: The Vice Commander will be responsible for the Group Commanders and for coordinating with outside agencies and higher headquarters. The general duties and responsibilities for the Chief of Staff will include, but not be restricted to, coordinating between staff members.
